

College of Liberal Arts & Sciences -- Plan of Study for Philosophy Majors

Consult with major advisor while completing this plan. Students must file this plan with their major advisor prior to preregistration in their fifth semester. An approved final plan of study must be filed with the Registrar during the first four weeks of classes of the semester in which a student expects to be graduated. Once it is filed with the registrar, changes in the plan may be made only with the consent of the major advisor.

The Major Group: (Major courses must be numbered 2000 or above). At least 24 credits in one department, or with the permission of the head of the student's major department, in two related departments (split major). Students must have a grade point average of 2.0 or better in the 24 credits constituting the group. Only quality points and credits earned at the University of Connecticut may be used to meet this requirement, save where the dean of the college grants exception.
